- 2013 Birth Defects Prevention Month: "Birth defects are common, costly, and critical". This is the theme chosen for the 2013 Birth Defects Prevention Month. The NBDPN Parent Advisory Group developed a Birth Defects Awareness Campaign, launched on 2 January 2013. A Public Service Announcement (PSA) video and a toolkit are available, free of charge, in both English and Spanish. However, you may translate both the PSA and toolkit materials into any language. Materials and packets are available to all Clearinghouse members and others who may want to use them in their own countries.

- The Pediatrics journal has published a new study: "Trends in survival among children with Down syndrome in 10 regions of the United States. Thanks to Csaba Siffel for providing this link: http://www.cdc.gov/ncbddd/features/keyfindings-dS-survival.html. This is the largest known population-based study on survival of people with Down syndrome (DS). Survival has increased over the time, but the study identifies certain factors, including low birth weight and the presence of a major heart defect that might increase the risk for death among babies born with DS. Increasing awareness of the risks associated with these factors can help health care providers better address medical needs and promote health among people with DS.

- · Methods for presentation and dissemination of birth defects data
- Program methodology: role of advisory committees, model legislation, methods for planning and evaluation, and/or prenatal and stillbirth surveillance
