What's going on regarding birth defects

- **Syphilis** continues to affect large numbers of pregnant women, causing substantial perinatal morbidity and mortality that could be prevented by early testing and treatment. A recent paper in *PlosOne Medicine* highlights the need to improve the quality of antenatal care and coverage (<http://www.plosmedicine.org/article/info%3Adoi%2F10.1371%2Fjournal.pmed.1001396>)
- The British Medical Association (BMA) calls for **mandatory folic acid fortification** to save lives and prevent disability (<http://bma.org.uk/news-views-analysis/the-bma-blog/2013/april/save-lives-and-prevent-disability-with-our-daily-bread>)

News from the Headquarter and Executive Committee

- The 2013 **Training Program on Surveillance and Prevention of Birth Defects and Preterm Births** is forthcoming (Geneva, May 27-31, 2013). We have 25 trainees from 16 countries and three observers (two from CDC and one from Flour Fortification Initiative). We have added this year a distance-based component, which reviews key issues in the epidemiology and prevention of birth defects, to prepare trainees for in-depth discussion and practical case studies.
- **The Executive Committee** will have its next meeting at the Clearinghouse Headquarter in Rome on June 27 and 28, 2013.
- **The 2013 ICBSR Annual Meeting** is confirmed for 3-6 December 2013 in San José, Costa Rica. The core organizing committee includes Gioacchino Scarano, Mark Canfield, Adriana Benavides, Eva Bermejo Sanchez and Marian Bakker.
- During the Annual Meeting there will be a workshop on **Genomics in Birth Defects Research**, organized by Osvaldo Mutchinick and Gioacchino Scarano. A questionnaire will be distributed soon to all the members to explore interest, local (country) facilities to obtain biological samples (blood, saliva, tissues) and specific rules and ethics governing the storage and shipping of this samples for the extraction of DNA to investigate the association of gene variants of selected candidate genes with a selected congenital malformation(s).
- The **ICBSR's listserv** has been very well received by members as a useful tool for communication and discussion. Everyone is encouraged to participate in it for group discussions that can help our organization to move forward.
- The Center is planning out an online survey on the **use of antidepressants in pregnancy**. Your participation in this survey will be very much appreciated.
