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## What's going on regarding birth defects

The **Teratology Society announced** that Dr. Godfrey Oakley wrote a draft **resolution for mandating folic acid fortification**, and this has been reviewed by the Public Affairs Committee and Council. The draft will be available for comments until July 21, and the revised resolution will be provided to the European Teratology Society (ETS) and the Japanese Teratology Society (JTS) for their consideration. Current wording of the draft, after listing the existing evidences, recommends:

- All governments require mandatory folic acid fortification of a centrally produced food such as wheat flour, corn flour
  or meal, and maize flour or meal to provide almost all adults with an additional at least 150 micrograms of folic acid
  per day,
- That a global strategic plan for the total prevention of folic acid dependent spina bifida and anencephaly by 2024 be written by 2017.
- That members of the Teratology Society champion mandatory folic acid fortification in their countries.
