
What's Going on Regarding Birth Defects

Progress of collaborative projects

- Collaborative project on **hypospadias:** two principal co-investigators have been identified, A.J. Agopian (The University of Texas, USA) and Natasha Nassar (University of Sidney, Australia). They have already started to plan the collaboration and process for working on the dataset.
- Collaborative study on "Prenatal diagnosis and congenital heart defects": the main protocol and a questionnaire on prenatal screening policies have been distributed recently among members. Currently, 15 programs expressed their interest to participate in the study.
