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What's Going on Regarding Birth Defects

World Birth Defects Day (WBDD) - March 3, 2016

The Clearinghouse is proud to have partnered with the Participating Organizations around the world to spread awareness on birth defects on March 3.

The WBDD **Thunderclap** campaign was among the first three trending campaigns, and had 947 supporters with 4.8 ml social reach.

The **Buzz Day** March 3 on Twitter, using the hashtag #WorldBDDay, was also successful: an audience of almost 4 ml of accounts and 9.5 ml of impressions were reached. Several local events, meetings, workshops, and symposiums have been launched by WBDD partners and supporters. ICBDSR is collecting information on local

events, in order to prepare a full report of the 2016 WBDD activities. As soon as it's ready, it will be posted in the ICBDSR website.

- Sad news: Dr. Edward (Ed) Lammer died unexpectedly on February 20, a few days before his 63rd birthday.Dr. Lammer's early career as a medical geneticist focused on an emerging syndrome in which women exposed to the anti-acne drug Accutane gave birth to children with a constellation of severe malformations. He is remembered as a dedicated advocate for the families of affected children. He used epidemiological approaches to study the genetic and environmental contributions to common major birth defects, including gene-environment interactions, and mentored many future scientists and doctors. He had retired a month prior to his passing but was still actively involved in multiple studies. It is a great loss for many of us and for the birth defects community.
